for a hurricane, prioritize safety and minimize potential damage. Focus on securing your apartment, protecting windows and doors, and having essential supplies ready.

Secure Your Apartment:

- Close and secure all windows and doors.
- Bring in outdoor furniture and decorations: Protect them from damage and prevent them from becoming projectiles.

Prepare an Emergency Kit & Gather Essential Supplies:

- Non-perishable food, water (at least one gallon per person per day), medications, first-aid kit, flashlights, batteries, a radio, and rain gear.
- Consider a "go bag" for evacuation.
- Evacuation planning: Know your evacuation zone.
- After the storm: Check for damage, assess any damage to your apartment and contact your landlord, if necessary.



Water safety

Maintain constant eye contact on kids in or around water, without distraction.



Child safety helmet

Make sure your kids wear a properly fitted bike or multisport helmet every time they ride.

Hydration

Encourage children to stay well-hydrated by drinking plenty of water before, during and after play.



Ways to Keep Your Kids Safe This

Playground safety

Visit parks with impact-absorbing material under equipment, and actively supervise them while they play.

5 Hot cars

Never leave your child alone in a car, not even for a minute.
